Matthew 17:1-9; Mark 9:2-10; Luke 9:28-36



The Story - Matthew 17:1-9

Now after six days Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, led them up on a high mountain by themselves; ²and He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light.

³And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Him. ⁴Then Peter answered and said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be

here; if You wish, let us make here three tabernacles: one for You, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

⁵While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!"

⁶And when the disciples heard it, they fell on their faces and were



greatly afraid. ⁷But Jesus came and touched them and said, "Arise, and do not be afraid."

⁸When they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no one but Jesus only.

⁹Now as they came down from the mountain, Jesus commanded them, saying, "Tell the vision to no one until the Son of Man is risen from the dead."

Outer Aim

Jesus shows the disciples He is the true God.

- 2. How was Jesus the same as other men?
- 3. Was Jesus trying to show He was God or man?
- 4. What things did Jesus know would soon be happening to Him?
- 5. Why do you think Jesus told the disciples they shouldn't tell others about the transfiguration?

John 1:14 - And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

John 10:17-18 - Therefore My Father loves Me, because I lay down My life that I may take it again.

No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself.

I have power to lay it down, and
I have power to take it again.
