
Jacob Returns to Canaan

Genesis 32, 33, 35



The Story

Jacob lived with his Uncle Laban for many years. He worked for his uncle to earn a wife and livestock. Jacob left his Uncle Laban's home. Jacob took Leah and Rachel, all his children, servants, and animals. They had to travel a long way back to Canaan. To get to Canaan, they would have to travel through the country where his brother Esau lived. It had been a long time since Jacob had seen Esau. The last time they were together, Esau wanted to harm Jacob.

Before seeing Esau, Jacob wanted to find out if his brother still wanted to kill him. He sent messengers to tell Esau he was coming with his family. The messengers returned and reported that Esau was coming to meet Jacob with 400 men. Jacob became afraid. He did not ask the Lord what he should do, but made his own plan to divide his family into two groups. Jacob thought that if Esau attacked one group, the other group would escape. Then Jacob prayed and asked the Lord to be with him. Jacob also got a large present of livestock ready for Esau.

That night, Jacob took his whole family and two female servants across the Jabok River. Jacob slept away from his family. During the night, the Lord came and wrestled with Jacob all night long. The Lord gave Jacob a sore hip as a reminder of the time that they wrestled. Jacob realized that he was wrestling with the Lord and asked for a blessing. The Lord gave Jacob a new name, Israel, and a blessing.

The day came for Jacob to meet his brother Esau. Jacob forgot to trust in the

Lord and followed the plan he had made to divide his family. Jacob's servants and their children went first, then Leah and her children, and last Rachel and her children. When Jacob was close to Esau, he bowed seven times. He wanted to show Esau that he was sorry for cheating and stealing the birthright from him. Esau was so happy to see his brother again. He did not want to kill Jacob anymore. Esau wanted to travel with Jacob, but Jacob was still not sure that he could trust Esau even after the Lord had promised to be with him. Jacob tried to get Esau to leave his family to travel alone. So Fsau went to his home and Jacob went in the opposite direction to Canaan.

After living in Canaan for a time, God wanted Jacob to move to a place called Bethel. While in Bethel, God came to bless Jacob and remind him that his family would become a mighty nation. Activity Two - Discuss the following questions.


- 1. Why didn't Jacob want to see Esau?
