
Ruth

The Story

you die." Then they both moved to Bethlehem. Naomi and Ruth were poor so Ruth worked very hard in a field of grain and gathered up the leftovers to make bread. God caused her to gather grain in the field of a rich believer named Boaz. Boaz was related to Naomi. He saw Ruth and asked who she was. When he heard how much Ruth loved and cared for Naomi, he told his workers to let her eat and drink with them. His workers should also leave extra grain behind just for her to pick up. He talked with Ruth and told her to keep on working in his field. She was very thankful to him for helping her, even though she was from a different country. Through Boaz, God blessed Ruth and Naomi with food to live on.

Ruth kept gathering in Boaz's field. Soon the Lord led Boaz and Ruth to marry. Now Boaz would take care of Ruth and Naomi. God planned a great blessing for them by giving them a baby boy named Obed. When Obed grew up, he had a son named Jesse. Jesse became the father of David, who became a king of Israel. Many, many years later, Jesus our Savior was born from the family of David.
